#### Operations ......Tim Kyle

Approved list of contractors - To protect SSC from liability and for everyone's safety, we have a policy much like other marinas, requiring contractors to register with us before they work on boats at Sadler. There will be a list of approved contractors on the Sadler bulletin board outside the clubhouse, so please check it - otherwise you could be liable for damages caused by an unregistered contractor. It's easy to get on our list: A contractor just needs to show me proof of Marina Operator's Liability and Worker's Compensation insurance.

We have three 30-foot docks available for sublease this summer. There are also two 26-foot docks available for permanent assignment. Contact me if you or someone you know is interested.

*Hoists* - Our hoists have been tuned up and are installed. They should be warmed up before use. It's tough on a hoist to snatch a load and lift it when it's cold. If you are the first one to use a hoist, please run it down and back up to warm up the motor and gearbox before lifting your boat. Also, please tie off the boom when you are finished with it to keep it from swinging freely when not in use.

Water system - There are two kinds of back flow connectors in use at the basin. The back flow is the brass piece that connects your hose to the water faucet. The original kind is a short fat connector and the new kind is longer and skinnier. If you plan to connect a hose with a sprayer and leave it connected, you need to have the new, long kind. We have a few in stock and will buy more as needed. In either case, all hoses and power cables must be secured so they are not in the water.

Gate cards will be required to enter the gate this year. Recently, somebody let themselves in and stole a pile of lumber that was purchased for a work day project. The push button that many non-members seem to know about has been disabled, so you'll need to use the new gold card that you should have received by now. If you require additional cards, they can be purchased at the Dairy Bar for \$3 each. Please remember that we are ALL responsible for the safety and security of ourselves as well as the club by keeping car doors and boats locked when few people are around.

*Opti Nationals will be a very busy time* at the club this year. We have arranged to provide dockage at the city marina for anybody wishing to get away from all the activity. Please let me know if you would like to take advantage of this opportunity as they have requested a head count prior to showing up.

The next meeting of the Sadler Basin Committee will be held at 7:00pm on Monday, May 1 at SSC.

## Race Governing ......Tom Cassidy

The last meeting of the Race Governing Committee was very productive. The fleet captains contributed ideas that we feel will help to solve some issues that have occurred in the past and increase participation in racing overall.

The Champion of Champions will be chaired each year by the SSC board member who is in charge of regattas. The CofCs will be raced on the last two Wednesday nights of the racing season. This year that will be Sept. 26 and Oct. 3. It will be a four-race series; two each day. Racers will alternate between spinnaker and JAM within each day. The second Wednesday will be match races between the top two boats from the previous week. Tie breakers will be decided based on the results of all four races. Complete details will be in the SIs.

Each fleet captain will regularly post the standings of the leading three boats in their fleet. That way skippers will have advance notice of their ranking and can line up crew.

We plan to use J24s in a round robin format.

*The Swanbeck Race* is scheduled for July 27. Because this falls within the week of the Opti Nationals (July 22-29), the club has arranged free dockage at the Sandusky Municipal Marina for any member not wanting to get "trapped" in the Opti traffic. The race will start from there, so anybody who is racing should definitely move their boat to SMM. Contact Club Manager Tim Kyle if you are planning to do so.

Casual Races - SSC is scheduling three casual races on June 15, July 6 and Aug. 17. The purpose of these races is to encourage and introduce non-racing members to our side of the sport. Members of the Race Governing Committee have volunteered to go on each boat as coaches to help crews with starts and mark roundings. These races are for NON-RACERS ONLY. These races will be called the Champagne Series.

Race Committee Crews - We are going to initiate a program to provide crews for the Race Committee boats. Each boat will have its crew assigned on a random basis. In exchange for volunteering, the participating boat will be awarded first place for that race. Each boat will be assigned once until all the fleet has participated in rotation. No boat can participate more than once a season. This system has been used successfully at a number of clubs nationwide. An experienced member of the RC (present or past) will be in charge of each boat. We will be acting as crew only.

#### Learn to Sail 2012 .....PC Mike Austin

It's time to firm up your plans to participate in the 2012 season of Learn to Sail. Registrations are coming in!

We will start the first session on the June 11 and run through Aug. 3.

All sessions will be one week long with the fees set at \$80 per session per camper. Signing up for multiple sessions is certainly encouraged.

All sessions are for children 7 years of age and older with beginner-to-intermediate level experience. Session V will include an advanced class. The Program Director and US Sailing Certified Instructors will assess student ability and assign students into a beginner group and an intermediate group according to skill level and ability. Beginner instruction will focus on water safety skills, rigging and derigging boats, nautical terms, knots, and elementary sailing skills. In the intermediate class, the emphasis will be on building the child's confidence in boat handling skills, including skippering the boat, sail trim, the sailing and racing "rules of the road" and an introduction to racing. Students are invited and encouraged to participate in as many sessions as possible. Registration for each class will be limited to 25 students and will be accepted on a first come, first served basis except in Session IV where pre-registration is required.

Life jackets will be worn at all times when on or near the water. A swimming test will be given by the instructors on the first day of class. All students must know how to swim with and without a life jacket.

You can see how many class slots are available in each session on the website. The 2012 schedule includes five full weeks of classes that will offer both AM and PM sessions. Because of our abbreviated 2012 schedule and the fact that we have reached out to the City of Sandusky Recreation Department, campers should sign up early to reserve slots.

Check the SSC website for helpful hints and registration. Plan early and reserve your weeks to avoid disappointment!

**Too many random boardings?** Michigan may have an answer. Reports of overzealous boardings of boats, particularly by Coast Guard personnel in western Lake Erie, aren't new. Indeed, over the years boaters and dealers alike have been critical of the Coast Guard randomly stopping boaters for time-consuming boardings that result in more animosity than boating safety.

Ken Alvey, president of the Lake Erie Marine Trades Association and a former chief of the Ohio Division of Watercraft, whose officers also stop and board boats, isn't any stranger to the problem. "Every agency wants to keep boating safe, but in my experience the effort to do a good job can go over the top," he says. "So we'd talk it out and try to reset a necessary and acceptable balance." Talking it out is what happened earlier this week as Alvey met with representatives of the Coast Guard and ODOW. Additional meetings between the dealers and the agencies are forthcoming.

The problem is complaints about random boardings are already ringing with the boating season just starting there. For example, a father and son were aboard Rocky Piacentino's demo Regulator drift fishing in a group of 20-25 boats at 9:50am when the Coast Guard randomly singled them out for boarding. Piacentino, owner of Catawba Moorings, reported that while boarding, a Coast Guard person lost footing and crashed into the canvas enclosure, ripping it up. The boarding took an hour and 10 minutes and at the end, the Coast Guard said they didn't even have a damage report form so Piacentino would have to go to the Coast Guard station to get one.

Similarly, Ted Patrick, owner of Lake & Bay Yachts Sales, has already been randomly stopped and boarded twice in the last two weeks. The second time, Patrick and the Coast Guard person recognized each other from the first boarding. Still, Patrick had to produce his driver's license. The Coast Guard demands everyone on the boat show a driver's license or I.D. unlike a comparable auto stop on land where everyone in the car isn't required to show I.D. "But I suppose I should be used to it," chuckles Patrick. "Last summer I was boarded three times and stopped a fourth."

It's not just dealers who are complaining. Patrick tells of a customer who was boarded as he left the West Harbor. After the boarding, the customer went on to nearby Kelley's Island for dinner. Upon returning from dinner, it was a two-fer night . . . the customer was boarded at the harbor entrance again! John Schroeder at Happy Days Boating Company echoes the other dealers. "I can't tell you how many times I've been held up on a demo ride for a Coast Guard boarding in the Portage River," he says. "Often prospects are visibly shaken when armed men suddenly climb aboard. They don't understand what's happening. It shouldn't be that way."

"Boaters say they're alienated by it all," says Piacentino. "They see the Coast Guard waiting outside the harbor to randomly board boats and some say they'd rather stay at the dock than go through the hassle. This shouldn't be happening."

Fortunately, for Piacentino, at least one thing worked out well . . . that customer did buy a new Regulator. Moreover, hoping to avoid future hassles, he even took his new boat to the Coast Guard Station for a boarding. He was given a yellow boarding report form and told: "If you're stopped and hold up this yellow report, it may keep you from being boarded again. But there's no guarantee."

Should there be some guarantee? Absolutely! And, Michigan may be the first state to decide legislating a happy middle ground is the best way to go. With the leadership of the Michigan Boating Industries Association, H.B. 5110 sponsored by Rep. Richard LeBlanc was overwhelmingly passed by the Michigan legislature and signed by Gov. Rick Snyder on March 22. It specifies that a vessel displaying a safety check decal cannot be stopped unless an officer has a "reasonable and articulable suspicion" the vessel is committing a maritime law violation or is otherwise engaged in criminal activity. Now that makes sense. Everyone wants safe boating. Safety inspections are valuable. Common sense says boaters should get them. But, common sense also says a policy of random boardings, frequently an hour or more and multiple times for the same vessel, is unreasonable. It's a sad day when common sense has to be legislated, but kudos to MBIA for making it more enjoyable for Michigan boaters. Norm Schultz

# **2012 Lightning Midwinters -** Coral Reed YC (Miami, FL) by Jim Ward

Last summer I received a call from my good friend and veteran

Lightning crew Jay Mueller asking if my wife Jayme and I had any interest in racing the Lightning Southern Circuit this year. The idea of getting out of Ohio during the winter, and having the opportunity to sail in Georgia and Florida sounded awfully inviting. Although, I was quick to point out a few "somewhat minor" concerns. For example, we don't own a Lightning, we don't currently own a tow vehicle that could make it to Miami, and Jayme and I had concerns about limited vacation time. Jay assured me that none of these "minor" details would be an issue. So we decided it sounded like a great idea and signed on. Jay was right, and we were able to borrow a boat, a set of sails, and a tow vehicle for the event.

We arrived in Savannah and called Jay who was there waiting for us at the airport in classic "Mueller" style. Four people with a weeks' worth of gear (we arrive with a other team from Cleveland) then tried to squeeze into a truck which was already stuffed to the headliner with: sailing gear, a giant cooler, a 12-14 feet of foam, and enough boat parts to build our own Mayflower replica. We somehow sardined ourselves into the vehicle, and made our way to the hotel.

While setting up the boat in Miami, I asked Greg Fisher if he would be willing to provide some tuning and boat handling advice, as the Lightning is much different from any boat I have ever sailed before. Greg spent over an hour with me tuning our boat, showing me how to set up the mast, and offering boat

handling advice. In the meantime, Jo Ann and my wife got to know each other over a cocktail in the parking lot. The next day we went out and won the first race. We owe a huge thanks to Greg for our boat speed. It was one of those rare races where everything just seems to come together, good start at the pin, nice 10 degree header, and after a few tacks Jay nailed the layline call as we found a puff that took as all the way to the weather mark on a nice lift. We were fortunate to stay ahead of David Starck and Victor Lobos of Chile at the finish. We were amazed by the number of boats that sailed by and gave us thumbs up signs, words of encouragement, and one of the Chilean boats even bowed as we went by. It was a great feeling, and really shows the warmth of the class. We followed it up with a couple of consistent races, and to our surprise after day one we found ourselves in 3rd overall out of 40+ boats behind Greg Fisher and David Starck, and just ahead of Eric Oetgen and David Dellenbaugh - it's truly surreal to even type that we were amongst such company in the standings. We joked at dinner that it would be comical if we could have a great first race on Sunday, perhaps some other boats have a tough race, and be able to put ourselves in position to win going into the last race.

The conditions that morning were similar to the first day with nice waves and the breeze in the 15-18 knot range. We had a great start in the first race, and ended up finishing second in a Chilean sandwich just ahead of defending World Champion Tito Gonzalez and a few boat lengths behind Felipe Robles and his team who sailed a great race leading the entire way. We looked back and saw Greg finish in a small pack of boats. We thought he either had an 8, 9, or 10? So we knew it would come down to who beat who in the last race. The last race was a lot of fun as we crossed the finish overlapped with the Fisher team, which allowed Greg, Jo Ann, and Jeff to deservingly win the Midwinter Championship. We ended up second overall, and I can truly say that was one of the most fun events I have ever sailed. The Lightning Midwinters is a tremendous group of sailors ranging from World Champions and past America's Cup tacticians to families racing in their 40th consecutive event. It was a great experience, we learned a lot, and we were proud to represent Sandusky Sailing Club. — Kind regards, Jim Ward


