Sandusky Junior Sailors, Inc. is currently accepting applications for a Sailing Program Director. Any interested candidates can apply as noted at the end of the following job description.

Job Title: Sailing Program Director

Job Summary: Part-time director position, running a seasonal sailing program.

Reports To: Board of Directors, SJS, Inc.

General Duties:

The Sailing Program Director is responsible for managing the seasonal sailing programs of SJS, Inc, including the Junior (6-18 years), Community and Adult Sailing Programs. The Director must possess excellent verbal and written communication skills. The Director is responsible for the recruiting, development and promotion of all SJS, Inc. sponsored sailing programs.

Specific Duties:

- Contributes content to the website, marketing materials and SSC Cross Bearings.
- Recruitment of new sailors and families into the SJS programs.
- Travel/Attend events meetings as required for program development, etc.
- Communicate with staff from other yacht clubs at local symposiums.
- Maintain and provide for the seaworthiness of the program's fleets including Optis, JY15s, 420s and J24s.
- Provide maintenance for all SJS, Inc. support equipment, resources and grounds to provide properly functioning equipment and safe facilities.
- Enforce policies of SJS, Inc. Escalate as required.
- Maintain an employee handbook and payroll records on all employees.
- Attend all SJS, Inc. meetings as requested by board.
- Provide regular and timely updates of program status to Board of Directors.

Junior Program Duties: The Director is responsible for scheduling and staffing Summer Junior Sailing Programs. The Director is responsible for the management of the budget and for the hiring of all staff as approved by the Board of Directors.

Specific Duties - Junior Program:

- Develop, implement and execute a Junior Program schedule.
- Determine program direction including instructor/student materials, skills tracking and feedback mechanisms.
- Determine staffing requirements and execute plan as approved by Board of Directors.
- Provide assistance, oversight and management of instructional staff.
- Manage program budget and track actual spending versus goals.
- Complete registration process, including collection of forms, payments, etc.
- Communicate regularly with sailors, parents and other interested parties.
- Develop and track individual performance metrics for all junior sailing instructors.

Specific Duties - Community & Adult Programs:

- Facilitate communication between interested students/parties and instructors.
- Assist with registration process, including collection of forms, payments, etc.

Experience: Minimum four years experience as a coach/instructor or Junior Program Director. Experience with the successful operation of a sailing program preferred. Candidate must have excellent communication and organization skills. Working knowledge of small sailboat operation, maintenance and repair is required. US Sailing Level I Instructor training is required.
