Open docks - We have several 30ft docks available for permanent assignment. There is also one 26ft dock available. If you know someone looking for a dock, please send them my way.

Hoists should be warmed up before use. It's tough on a hoist to snatch a load and lift it when it's cold. If you are the first one to use a hoist, please run it down and back up to warm up the motor and gearbox before lifting your boat.

Sailing etiquette - Please be considerate of other boaters when entering and leaving Sadler Basin. Although every boat is responsible for keeping clear of other boats, keep in mind that boats under sail have rights over boats that are motoring, a boat under way has rights over a boat backing from a slip, and a boat returning has rights over a boat leaving the marina. It's a good idea to have a crew member assigned to look out for other boats before last second evasive maneuvers are necessary.

Avoid keel damage - When entering the basin, stay 100 yards off shore until the white light pole is in the center of the opening. Then turn and head directly for the opening. When exiting, make sure you continue straight out of the opening for at least 100 yards before turning. Several large rocks have been reported near the shoreline by some unlucky sailors.

Trash - Please deposit bags of trash from your boat in the dumpster and not the trash cans located around the clubhouse. This will help control the cost of can liners and reduce the frequency of emptying the cans. Your help with this is greatly appreciated!

Electrical policy for the Sadler Sailing Basin - Your Sadler Sailing Basin Committee was planning to provide an electrical outlet for each boat by this sailing season. The need to dredge put this project on hold. We also became aware of some additional problems with our power supply and infrastructure. The committee is working on a comprehensive plan and hopes to complete this project in 2014 or 2015.

Until we are able to provide an outlet for each boat, it is necessary to share electrical connections. An Electrical Policy has been established for the safety and convenience of our members.

- A. Shore power cords
 - 1. Must be 30 Amp, 125 volt, UL approved
 - 2. Locking type
 - 3. Waterproof seal
 - 4. Disconnected from outlet when vessel leaves the dock
 - 5. Properly supported to provide strain relief to outlet
 - 6. Standard 3 prong 15 Amp, 120 volt cords are prohibited
- 7. May not be laid across the deck but led under to prevent a tripping hazard and be protected against chafe
- B. Power Consumption The committee strongly urges berth holders to do the following:
 - 1. Minimize consumption as much as possible
 - 2. Disconnect from the outlet when power is not truly needed on their boat so others who need power have easier access.
 - 3. Not operate AC units when the boat is not occupied.
- C. Swimming in the marina is prohibited due to the possibility of electrocution.

Note that the net amount of water diverted into the Great Lakes is greater than the amount diverted out. 1560 The Welland and NY State Barge canals are intra-basin diversions, meaning the diverted water does not leave the Great Lakes basin. Well, it did not go as well as we had hoped or as expected. The boat was very nice, and the sponsors even nicer.

The new 3DI North Sails seemed fast during practice. But we, the crew, were a little rusty compared to other boats, most of which competed at Key West. However, we had Kimo Worthington on board with us from EF Language fame, so we had real experience on board.

FRIDAY - Race 1 went well despite our rustiness. We were OSC and battled back to take a 7th, and were only 12 seconds out of 5th. Race 2 – We won the start and felt very competitive, but the boat was new to us, the seas were large and confused, and we fell back to this time 6th. We were learning the boat but felt we had some improving to

do. Race 3- The winds had now picked up to 22+ with large rollers and chop. We again won the start and proceeded to find our way to the port tack lay line and a second place rounding behind the winner of our class. As bad fortune would have it, the 4th place vessel did not see us struggle to fall off with a stuck main sheet and T-boned us, HARD, causing considerable damage to both our boats. We immediately retired and went in. For reasons unknown and beyond belief, after breaking rules 11, 12 and 14, this jury DSQ'd us. The boat was

repaired by the crew and the Beneteau area guy. We are appealing this decision with US Sailing.

SATURDAY - We again won the start and rounded the first weather mark in second. We had 3 more solid legs, but ended up in 6th again, but only 5 seconds out of 3rd, and 30 out of 2nd. Great, tight racing! Race 2 – Winds were steady and the seas were better for us. We had another good start and again rounded the first

weather mark in second. This race ended up being our best race at 4th, and we were only 5 seconds out of 3rd place. Race 3 on Saturday we had good weather legs. We had an issue with one jibe on the last leg. We ended up again in 6th place, only 30 seconds out of 4th.

SUNDAY- All racing was cancelled due to Gale Force winds.

For the series, we ended up in 7th with 29 points, 2 points out of 6th. With one minute less corrected time, we would have dropped 10 points, and taken a 4th.

All in all, it was a great event, action packed, and the competition was a tough. With a little more time in this brand new Beneteau First 35 we could have done much better. It was a great experience. It was an honor to have been chosen by SAIL Magazine to represent in the Best Around the Buoys Contest.


