At 3pm, join us in the Commodore's Funday Race. Races will be an anything goes elimination series, open to all who dare to participate and will take place in Optis. The race course will be off of Springer's Wharf to allow viewing for competitors, spectators and hecklers. Then at 6, we will gather under the pavilion for a Bring-Your-Own dinner/gathering/fleet meeting where we will enjoy each other's company and discuss our July, August, and September activities and opportunities.



Wednesday July 17th thru Sunday July 21st

- The races will be governed by the rules as defined in The ISAF Racing Rules of Sailing for 2013-2016
- Measuring and Registration will be on Wednesday the 17th from 1200 to 2000 hours at the Sandusky Sailing Club.
- Wednesday evening at 1800 hours is scheduled to be the 1st warning signal of the Women's and Junior Championship Races, plan is to sail three races. Crews for these races can be of your choice as long as a Woman or Junior is at the helm.
- Thursday plan is for two races for the Championship Fleet and one for the Challenger Fleet; 1st warning signal is scheduled to be at 1300 hours.
- Friday and Saturday's plan is for three races each day for the Championship Fleet and two
 races each day for the Challenger Fleet; 1st warning signal scheduled to be at 1000 hours each
 day.
- Sunday plan is for two races for the Championship Fleet and one for the Challenger fleet; 1st warning signal is scheduled to be at 1000 hours. No races will start after 1300 hours.
- The number of races per day is preliminary. The official schedule will be in the sailing instructions provided at registration
- All radio communications between the RC and the competitors will be on a VHF channel to be announced at the competitors' meeting.
