The Sunday/Funday series of 8 races for PHRF/JAM sailors is included again this year, with starting time at 0900 hours on the scheduled days.

Also noteworthy is that, in addition to the traditional races series on Wednesday evenings and Sunday mornings, SSC will host the Lightning Class Districts June 23-24, and the Great Lakes J/24 Championship Sept. 8-9. We are also providing Race Committee and Registration for the Sandusky Bicentennial Regatta July 21. Along with our annual One-Design Regatta (June 9-10) and SJRT Junior Regatta (moved to July 28 this year), the above events promise lots of sailing and an exciting season of racing.

#### Race Committee Boats ......Terry Parker

Comm. Mark has resurrected what used to be called the Towboat Committee. Re-christened as the RC Boat Committee, its members currently are Trustees Ryan Kyle and Andy Davis, along with Phil Spicer and myself as chair. We have been tasked with overseeing the maintenance, commissioning, and operation of the committee boats. Our aging fleet needs some TLC in places, and significant repair/replacement in others. We have organized a list of tasks and are working toward launch soon after workday.

Escorts I and III have been moved from Deep Water for bottom blasting and barrier coating.

Escort II suffered significant mechanical issues last summer, some of which remain unresolved. After lengthy discussion, the committee recommended, and the Board approved at the March meeting, to replace Escort II. We are currently in the process of purchasing a 1996 Grady-White 24', contingent on survey and sea trial. It should be prepared and ready for the start of racing season. Money for this came from the Race Committee Boat Fund, accrued over the years from Board set-asides, donations, and investment income - not from club operating funds or dues. The Board will determine the disposition of Escort II in the near future.




