So, this month's missive comes from the Niday Shelter in Virginia where we are sitting out (hopefully) the only rain this week. I'm hoping to be high enough on Brush Mountain to send an email tomorrow morning.

Volunteers – First item to report is my gratitude to people who have agreed to step up and help the club-- first is Reed Carpenter who has agreed to serve on the Membership Committee. The second is Karl VanderHorst who has agreed to serve on the Sadler Basin Committee. It's volunteers like these two gentlemen who keep SSC running.

Springer's Wharf – My other item is an update on Springer's Wharf. If you've been to the club lately, you know that we've been busy. That work has been noted by people outside of our club and there have been some questions about what we're doing (repairs and maintenance), are we making secret improvements (we aren't), and whether we should have gotten

a permit (we did). Just to make sure that all of our members know what we've done, here's the short version: We noticed cracking in the concrete deck of Springer's Wharf. Thus we limited traffic until inspections were completed. We then made sure the base was stable by contracting for professional ground penetrating radar and soil borings. When the base checked out, we commissioned Fosco Concrete to obtain a permit on our behalf and pour. Thanks to all of Sadler Basin Committee's diligence, we have every expectation that these repairs will last another 30 years.

St. Patrick's Day party – Otherwise, it's been a bit quiet, with the exceptions of RC Andy's Winter Wednesday and Jay and Beth's St. Patrick's Day party, which was a highlight. If you missed these, you definitely missed good food and good times.



We had a great meeting in March with the class regatta chairman and I am looking forward to this event. The Highlander Nationals has been added as a Facebook event, so feel free to check it out and share it as much as possible. Information is still being coordinated and will be updated on Facebook and on the SSC Regattas' web page. I will need everyone's help volunteering to make this a success as is par for regattas hosted by SSC. If you can volunteer for the Highlander Nationals, please contact me using my information below. Social events – The Communications Committee will be utilizing Social Media more this year and is asking members to tag SSC in their posts. We have been exploring different apps to allow us to send out group texts and we're close to releasing this to the members.

Sailing Simulator – Don't be afraid to use the Sailing Simulator if you're at the club and it's up and running. If you need to be shown how to use it, stop by the club on April 6 to watch the Vermilion Junior Sailing Team utilize the Simulator to get some practice in before getting back on the water.

Gate Operation – The gate will always appear to be closed at the club unless we have a regatta and someone is working the gate to let vehicles/trailers into the club to unload. I say appear because we have changed a few things this spring with the gate operation. The gate will remain shut vs. being open for weekends/LTS, but that's where the first change will be

noticeable. If the gate is "Open," before a member gets to the key card post, the gate will open and stay open for a much shorter time now. If you pull up to the key card post and the gate doesn't open as soon as you cross the sidewalk, then you will need to use your key card. Once your vehicle crosses the gate, a laser sensor will now detect when an object or objects are in a defined field that runs out to the island in the driveway. As long as anything is in that field, the gate will not start the close cycle. Once the gate begins the close cycle, the gate will remain open for only 3-5 seconds before closing. In the past the close cycle was set to 40 seconds; not anymore. When you come down for Spring Workday, you will get to experience the new method of gate operation.

Springer's Wharf – There has been a lot of activity the past few months on Springer's Wharf. Voids below the existing concrete were discovered using ground penetrating radar. Soil boring followed, which informed us of the strength of the material of the sub surface stone. After both tests were completed and evaluated, Fosco Concrete was hired to demolish and remove the existing concrete, repair the entryway wall, install steel reinforcements, and replace the concrete. Dependent on temperatures and weather, the final process of pouring the new concrete should have been completed the week of March 25.

You must have the CBP Roam App on your phone or tablet unless all of your crew members have Global Entry cards or an I-68. Please double-check for yourself and register well in advance for this. John and I took care of this last fall, but it took us some time as we were experiencing difficulty with the government site. I'm told the kinks have been worked out from last season and it's fast and easy. Here are links to the sites with information about the new US Customs and Border Protection requirements.


