We're San Francisco Bound!

Sandusky Sailing Club Youth Sailors qualify for a historic national championship return. For the first time since 1953, Sandusky Sailing Club will represent Area E at the Chubb U.S. Youth Triplehanded Championship for the Sears Cup, US Sailing's oldest and most prestigious youth national championship. The 2025 championship will take place at the iconic St. Francis Yacht Club on San Francisco Bay.

Our team — made up of SSC family members and junior members Cameron Bert, Hadley Langolf, Charlotte Langolf, and Molly Keane — earned their place at nationals by winning the Area E Qualifier, hosted right here at SSC on the waters of Sandusky Bay. They raced aboard **Booyah!**, a J/24 generously loaned by fellow SSC members Cole Hanley, Michael Palmer, and PC William Semans, who not only provided the boat but also worked alongside our sailors to help them master the transition to larger keelboats.

This effort reflects SSC's commitment to giving young sailors bigger opportunities — with access to larger boats

and larger bodies of water — preparing them to compete at the highest levels of youth sailing. It's another proud moment that reaffirms Sandusky Sailing Club's leadership in fostering competitive keelboat sailing in our region.

The Sears Cup, first sailed in 1921, is US Sailing's national championship for triplehanded youth teams and remains the organization's oldest youth trophy. It serves as a vital stepping stone into the world of keelboat racing and beyond. This year's national championship will be sailed in J/22s with four-person crews, providing the perfect platform for teamwork, tactical racing, and national-level competition.

Adding to the excitement for 2025 — the winning team will earn a wildcard entry to the Youth SAILING Champions League Final, an international competition where the best youth teams from around the world square off on a global stage.

For SSC, this isn't just about racing. It's about history, pride, and the next generation stepping up to carry forward a legacy. Our last appearance at the Sears Cup was in 1953, when Sandusky sailors competed in the regatta held in Havana, Cuba. Over 70 years later, we're heading west — San Francisco, here we come!

Thank you to our SSC community, our volunteers, and all those who helped make this possible. The journey continues.

SSC Auxiliary Fleet Sailing Instructions

2025 Wednesday Night Series

1 RULES

- 1.1 The races/series will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing for 2025-2028. (RRS)
- 1.2 The PHRF-LE Code of Regulations will apply.
- 1.3 The T-10 Class One Design Rules will apply.
- 1.4 These Sailing Instructions (SI's) will apply.
- 1.5 Race dates, warning times and start order are specified in the 2025 SSC Race Schedule.
- 1.6 The Wednesday Evening Race Courses – Auxiliary 2025 edition will apply.
- 1.7 The NOR issued by each fleet will apply.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS & CHANGES TO THE SI's

Notices to competitors and changes to these SI's will be posted on the Race Notice bulletin board located on the east wall of the SSC Clubhouse. Any change to these SI's will be posted no later than 2 hours prior to the first class start.

3 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 3.1 Signals made ashore shall be displayed from the flag stand on ESCORT I
- 3.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in the race signal AP.

4 CLASS FLAGS

JAM A / B Purple
PHRF / T-10 Green with yellow diagonal

5 MARKS

The starting mark will be an orange inflatable.
Mark 1 will be an orange inflatable
Mark 14 will be the R"14" channel buoy.
Mark 3 will be G"3" channel buoy.
Mark 5 will be G"5" channel buoy.
Mark 16 will be R"16" channel buoy.

6 PENALTY SYSTEM

RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

7 THE START

The starting line will be between a nearby orange inflatable mark and the staff on the signal boat holding an orange flag.

8 THE FINISH

The finish line will be between an inflatable mark and the SSC entry buoy.

9 TIME LIMITS

- 9.1 If no boat has passed the first fixed mark within 1 hour of their start, the race will be abandoned for all classes.
- 9.2 If the first boat within each fleet has not finished within two hours of their start, the race will be abandoned for that fleet.

10 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

Protest forms are available in the Commodore's Room. Protests and requests for redress shall be delivered to the Commodore's Room within 1 hour after the RC boat docks.

11 SCORING

RRS A4 low point scoring system shall apply.

12 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 12.1 When Code Flag "L" is displayed, all boats racing are required to sail past the transom of the RC signal boat and supply their boat name, sail numbers and class to be raced.
- 12.2 A boat that retires from the race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

13 RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 13.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make wireless transmissions while racing nor receive wireless communications not freely available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.
- 13.2 Except for emergencies, communications with the race committee shall not be initiated during any starting sequence.

- 13.3 SSC RC boats use VHF channels 68 and/or 72 for race communications.
- 13.4 Race committee boats will monitor channel 16, as required by FCC rules, whenever not actively communicating on another channel.

14 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the series entirely at their own risk. See RRS Rule 3 "Decision to Race". The Sandusky Sailing Club will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the races within this series.

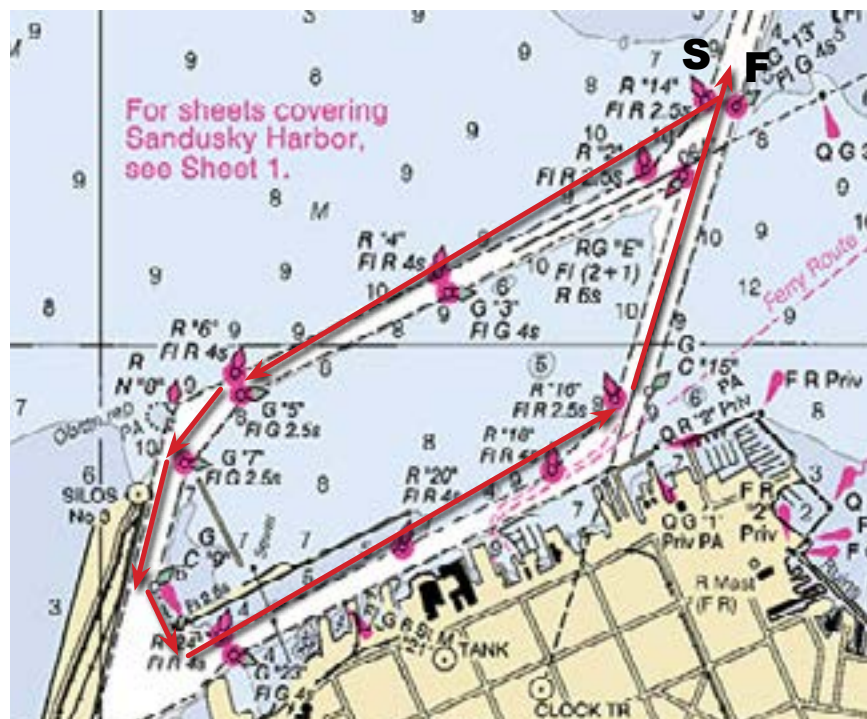
After 1 September 2025 the start time will be moved up one half hour to 1830 and 1840 hrs. respectively.
