# SSC Iceboat Fleet ..... Ryan Kyle

As the temperatures begin to fall, and the soft-water boats are put away for the winter season, it's time to begin thinking ICE and dust off those ice boats for the upcoming ice boating season. In recent years, SSC has done a great job supporting ice boating in the winter by opening the club on weekends when we have good ice, with a small crowd of people participating. Because this relationship between SSC and ice boating has formed, we decided it was time to formulate a new fleet; the SSC Iceboat Feet.

Last winter, PC Bryan Huntley and I began brainstorming a way to formally involve the club in ice boating and decided that because there is so much club-member activity and interest in ice boating, we should form a fleet to support it,



much like the Cruising, JAM, PHRF, Multihull and Interlake Fleets that are active today. Although the Sandusky Ice Yacht Club exists, and will continue to remain active, the SSC Iceboat Fleet will support ice boating on Sandusky Bay by ensuring there is access to the ice via Springer's Wharf and the historic iceboat ramp.

In the 1980's, the Sandusky ice boating scene was being harbored at the foot of Ogontz St. The group decided that the shore access, although practical, was not ideal for holding larger iceboat regattas and weekend activity. A select group of SSC Past Commodores and SIYC members combined resources and came up with the idea to construct a ramp off of Springer's Wharf that would act as a safe access point to the frozen Sandusky Bay. The ramp was then constructed and was donated to the Sadler Sailing Basin and would act as one of the best access points to ice boating on the North Coast. Since then, the ramp has been used for access to the ice by iceboat enthusiasts from all over the world. In fact, in both 1984 and 2004, the DN North American Championships were



held on Sandusky Bay, using the ramp and Springer's Wharf as the launch site.

The SSC Iceboat Fleet will focus on continuing the tradition of ice boating on Sandusky Bay by providing access to a frozen Sandusky Bay via the iceboat ramp on Springer's Wharf. We are looking for people that have an iceboat, or are interested in ice boating to become members of the fleet. Our fleet dues are \$20 and can be made payable to Sandusky Sailing Club. Please include a memo on

the check; "Iceboat Fleet." Also, look for the option to join the iceboat fleet via the SSC membership renewal form. Money collected for iceboat fleet dues will help offset the cost of maintaining and erecting/dismantling the ramp and crane on Springer's Wharf each year.

As fleet captain, I look forward to seeing everyone on the ice this winter. Whether you have an old iceboat hanging in the rafters, or a world class skeeter in an enclosed trailer, we encourage everyone to bring their boats down when there is ice and set them up for a day of fun.
