**In-Water Winter Storage-** We've had some boats sit in the mud during this last round of low water. The deicers are doing a good job of keeping the ice clear through it all.

**2026 dock contracts** were emailed out on Oct. 17. We had some incorrect invoices go out early and I have sent notices of short payments to those that paid on them. I'm maintaining the 5% discount for those short payments. Email me if you have any questions.

Again, please note! Since this is the first year we are requiring signed contracts and proof of insurance, this bears repeating:

**Contract and insurance forms required for winter and spring dockage-** Many members are Dead Last when it comes to sending their filled out contracts and proof of insurance forms. This year, we require those forms to be received by the Sadler Board prior to bringing your boat into the marina. There will be a penalty for not complying. This helps protect the club from difficult situations and gives contact information for emergencies. The requirements and penalties are outlined in the contract form.

**Your boat plans-** If you are not going to need an SSC dock this year, please let us know right away. If you are considering purchasing a new boat or selling your old one, let us know so we can anticipate your dockage requirements for 2026. Just like on the starting line, we can't anticipate everyone's actions so giving us a heads-up would be appreciated.

**Dock availability-** We currently have all sizes of slips available for rent in 2026 except for 45'. Spread the word about how great SSC is, to help fill those empty docks. The waiting list has been fulfilled for this season so it's now first come, first served. If you want to change the slip you're in, contact me!

## Cruising Fleet..... RC Robbie Stone

Before sharing some of the great ideas that came out of our Cruising Fleet brainstorming session, I want to take a moment to explain why I believe this fleet is so important. At my core, I believe that more people sailing is good for SSC and good for the sport as a whole. According to a 2023 US Sailing survey, more than 90% of avid racers began as cruisers or day sailors. In the 1970s, 37% of sailors actively raced; today, that number is under 15%.

Sandusky Sailing Club's heritage is deeply rooted in racing, but the Cruising Fleet can play a vital role in supporting that tradition. It helps grow future racers while also attracting and retaining the 85% of sailors who prefer cruising and day sailing. Strengthening this side of the club strengthens the entire club.

I recently stumbled across an article I wrote after my first year of racing. Before that, I proudly called myself a cruiser. The key idea still holds true: Racing is really just cruising around some marks—and when you look at it that way, it becomes a lot more fun. I'll share more thoughts on the synergy between cruising and racing as we continue building momentum.

Despite a few technical hiccups and some incorrect dates, we successfully held our brainstorming session to relaunch the Cruising Fleet. The ideas were fantastic, and I'm excited to share the developing vision, the plan, and next year's calendar once everything is finalized. For now, here's a preview of what's being considered.

### Vision

- Incorporate sailing training for new sailors into our events.
- Build a network of experienced sailors to support new members.
- Collaborate with the Racing Fleet to create opportunities for new sailors to learn about racing.
- Offer "how to" sessions on a variety of sailing topics.


DEW INDICATES A GOOD DAY AHEAD; A DRY MORNING IS SIGN OF SHOWERS.




DISTANT SHORES LOOM UP NEARER BEFORE RAIN BECAUSE OF THINNING OF THE AIR.




LARGE HALO AROUND THE MOON INDICATES CIRRUS CLOUDFORM & WARM FRONT RAIN.




A VEERING WIND IS SIGN OF FAIR WEATHER; BACKING WIND MEANS RAIN.




FALLING BAROMETER INDICATES NEARING "LOW" AREA, WITH WINDS AND RAIN.




RAIN IS MOST FREQUENT AT THE TURN OF THE TIDE (IF AIR IS HUMID)




RAINBOW TO WIND-WARD, RAIN AHEAD. RAINBOW TO LEE-WARD, RAINS END.



HIGHER THE CLOUDS, FINER THE WEATHER. LOWERING CEILINGS FORETELL A RAIN.




