Commodore's Comments Comm. John Schwartz

This newsletter is somewhat late because I am an epic procrastinator. If anyone is inclined, I would encourage you to check out a website that I like: <u>www.despair.com</u>. It is a business that seems to have sprung up making fun of corporate motivational posters. It features really pretty pictures with strong font underneath. I have a few favorites, which I will be happy to share at length at the bar if anyone is interested, but one of the more appropriate ones for me is, "A stitch in time might save nine, but procrastination pays off right now."

On the up side, recent studies show a correlation between waiting until the last possible minute and creativity. So, my tardiness is really just my way of helping PC Winkel be more creative. You're welcome, Eric.

The Sadler Basin Committee has a fair amount going on. By the way, we need to add another member to the Sadler Committee board. I do have a short list to work from, but if you are a 10-year member and a berthholder and interested, please let me know. This is a very important committee. I believe that the SSC social club is the heart of our community, but the marina operations are where the big money gets made and spent.

I know that PC Muhn has done club history presentations in years past. It's enlightening and I would encourage

members to ask him about that history. The SSC Board has authorized a few significant things over the past two months in regard to Sadler.

First, we gave the Sadler Committee more authority to spend money on marina expenses without having to wait for board approval.

Second, we've committed to purchasing four 40' docks to replace four 35' docks that no longer float. We are not changing the location of the docks at this point, so the width of the berths with the new docks is slim for a 40' dock. At some point, we'll end up with enough longer docks that it will make sense to redo the water and power to accommodate wider berths, but that won't happen until Comm. Andy's watch.

Repairs to Springer's Wharf are underway as well. If you've been down to the club, you've noticed that Tim has chained off Springer's so cars can't access it while the work goes on.

Other items of interest at the SSC Board meeting--

SSC granted free dock space to SJSI (Sandusky Junior Sailing Inc.), the 501c3 that manage Learn To Sail, Adaptive Sailing, the Sandusky Junior Race Team (SJRT), and other community outreach programs.

Also, there was a significant amount of discussion about SSC's St. Patrick's Day party that Jay Austin is chairing again this year. Terry Parker and a number of SSC volunteers have been doing a full reconditioning of one of the race committee boats this winter and there is interest in having the party proceeds be specifically designated to RC boat repair expenses.

That led to a good discussion about such things as the cost/trouble of managing restricted donations, and also that it seems likely that many people don't know how the club really spends its money. When you make a donation to the general operating fund, SSC spends that money on things like RC boat repairs, Junior Sailing, social events, etc.

I hope people come out to support these events and others, because they are fun and they are vital for SSC's future.

If you missed RC Davis' Wine Tasting event, you really missed some good food and drink. Scuttlebutt is that Andy's still scrubbing sauce off the ceiling.



My final update is a change in SSC policy related to Wednesday night racing and Race Committee. It's easy to take for granted because the RC makes it look so automatic, but SSC is blessed with an extraordinarily diligent and qualified Race Committee. However, they need help to keep delivering the same quality and frequency of racing we're all proud of.

SSC's new policy is that ALL participants in Wednesday night races will have one assigned Wednesday during the season to help the Race Committee and perform galley duty. Your boat will not race that night and will be assigned your average score for that series. However, if a boat doesn't show for their scheduled service, that boat will be disqualified from the series. I'm sure that other racers and the RC will work with you if dates need to be swapped, etc.

This started last year and by all reports was positive, so this year the board, fleet captains and Race Committee felt that the best way to continue was to make it a consistent rule applied to all racers. Many hands, light work.

That's all I've got for this month. I hope to see you all around the club at one of RC Davis' events. Stay warm.
