**2018 Regattas -** 2018 will be a great year for competitive sailing at SSC! Jay Austin and the Regatta Committee have been busy. Keep a lookout for opportunities to help with all of the regattas that we will be running this season. Let's make sure we uphold the Sandusky Sailing Club's reputation for hosting the best regattas in the country!

*Mark your calendars -* On May 19, we will again be hosting the Steak Out Party to welcome our new members and kick off the summer social calendar. Also, please come to the club on May 28 for our annual Memorial Day service. This year, PC Monty Kaufman will follow up the service with our Blessing of the Fleet.

*Liquor Permit Premises Update -* As we announced at the spring General Meeting, the Board has taken action to expand our club's liquor permit premises. The previously defined premises did not adequately serve our club's needs or the manner in which our club regularly operates, so an expansion became necessary. The attached drawing shows the new boundaries of our permit premises. We will also post this drawing at the clubhouse.

Along with the expansion, we are required by state law to install fencing and signage clearly showing the boundaries. At present, there are temporary metal stakes serving that purpose. We are working on a permanent solution that meets the requirements of the Division of Liquor Control, but that is also attractive and that will add to the appeal of our clubhouse and grounds.

Though the boundaries have changed, the rules for SSCpurchased alcohol and outside alcohol have not. We will post these rules at the clubhouse as a refresher for our members.

1. As before, any open container purchased at the Dairy Bar or otherwise from SSC may be carried and consumed in our permit premises but may not be removed from the permit premises. 2. Also, as before, any outside alcohol, whether an open or closed container, purchased anywhere other than from SSC, may not be brought onto the permit premises.

3. Last, you may purchase closed containers (12-packs and cases of beer, etc.) from the Dairy Bar and then must take them from the permit premises, to your boat for instance. Closed containers may not be opened on or returned to the premises.

Unfortunately, this means that members may not bring their own alcohol onto the liquor premises, including the pavilion. The Board was cognizant that some of our members have enjoyed a cookout and a bottle of wine or some drinks of their own in the pavilion, though. While the new premises boundaries will no longer allow that, we have set up a picnic area adjacent to the boundary that allows easy access to the galley, grills, and restrooms, while providing a shady area to spend your afternoons and evenings. Important, at the same time it allows us to follow the state law prohibition on bringing outside alcohol onto a liquor permit premises. This is a temporary solution to give us an opportunity to determine the needs of these members. We welcome your comments and suggestions in this regard and look forward to a more permanent solution as we adjust to our new premises boundaries.





### Communication Committee......RC Matt Bedee

What is it? In the past I have written about the Website Committee and for 2018, Comm. Mark Gross made the decision to create the Communications Committee that rolled the Website Committee into it. The Communications Committee is made up of a wide variety of SSC Members locals and out of towners, so we are getting great feedback and excite from all involved.

What are we doing? We are looking to improve communications with the members and the public. We are only on our second meeting after the initial meeting to determine what the committee will be doing.

So what will we be doing? We will be looking at public relations (including making sure the SSC brand is consistent for all documents), Cross Bearings, Yearbook, Email addresses for committees, social media options, website updates/upgrades, and currently testing web meeting options to take to the May SSC Board Meeting for approval. Email Addresses have been created for the Regatta Committee (**Regatta@sanduskysailingclub.com**), Learn to Sail (**Learn@sanduskysailingclub.com**), along with the previous email addresses; **Info@sanduskysailingclub.com**, and **Manager@ sanduskysailingclub.com**. I will update you when the addition of other site are complete.

If you need to reach the SSC Board, you can send an email to <u>SSCBoard@sanduskysailingclub.com</u> and everyone on the SSC Board will receive your email. This allows the Communications Committee to worry about who needs to be included in the email addresses vs members and someone who gets left off an email or they are not associated with that group anymore.

*Web Meetings* will be happening at SSC and its implementation will be determined by the SSC Board. Once that is finalized, we will send information to the various committee chairs to utilize for their meetings, including the SSC Board meetings.

You will have to be patient when using this as not everyone has experience with web meetings. Whatever option we choose for the web meetings, personal laptops will be able to be utilized for the time being.

*The Wi-Fi system* will be looked at as well (or the Wifey System as someone mentioned in VC Schwartz's Survey). I will contact Buckeye Broadband to upgrade our hardware, which will make the Wi-Fi more reliable in the clubhouse this year. We will also have a password for the Wi-Fi, which will be shared in some manner once that is set up.

Our goal is to make sure that when we have regattas/ events/meetings at the club, we have a reliable Wi-Fi for scoring, web meetings, etc. We also want to make the clubhouse a place that people will consider using when working remotely. I have done it several times over the years and work is not as bad when you have the views of Sandusky Bay that we have from sitting in the clubhouse.

Wi-Fi coverage at the docks will be something we have to look at down the road as this could be a substantial investment that has a very short lifespan as technology changes rapidly. The SSC Board has heard your voices, but we need to make sure we spend funds wisely. Keep in mind that a few years ago, no one had the hot spot feature on their smart phones without paying for it. Now many wireless companies have a hot spot feature automatically enabled and some have the hot spot data separate from the smart phone's monthly data allowance.
