

You may have seen photos on Facebook from this last weekend's high water and most of that water was coming from Springer's Wharf and was held in the parking by the wall. On Monday and Tuesday this week, the Flag Officers helped Wendy and Leo put sandbags on Springer's to divert water away from the parking lot. Leo has also installed relief gates in the wall to allow water to flow from the parking lot to the basin. PC Mike Fishbaugh has fabricated three new ramps and they have been installed to get us over the wall and to keep members off the slippery concrete. There will be times that we have high water and there will not be anything we can do about it. The goal this year was to have 50% of the high water days be dry at the club and we will work through the other days. Just understand that the Sadler Committee and the Board heard our members and we have taken steps to reduce the effects of the high water on our enjoyment of the club.

Lemonade from lemons - I think we have an opportunity to do a lot of great things this summer as necessity is the mother of invention - or maybe reinvention in SSC's case. 
Basin and Grounds Update:

Water retention project - At this point, the "wall" has been installed, and based on first tests last Saturday and Sunday, is working superbly. I wanted to put a shout out to Leo and PC Wendy Kaufman for all their efforts and time provided to this project.

You will notice some bags along the wall as there is seepage coming up from the ground in many areas; the bags are to address seepage and keep the parking lot as dry as possible. There have also been multiple pumps installed to pump out that seepage.

Now, that said, last Saturday and Sunday (for those who were down there) the water was so high that it was breaching the wall at the north end of the parking lot. (see picture, circle point of breach) This week the team positioned sandbags along the fence to reduce the likelihood of that happening again (diverting flow away from parking lot).



Given you cannot control Mother Nature, I must say that through the efforts of the team, we are in a better position to reduce Mother Nature's fury. Thanks again everyone involved.

Workday - It is that time of year where many things need to happen. Soon we should have better line of sight to how we will open up for sailing — WAHOOOO! That said, there are always things that can be done, should you have some time. Things like weeding, picking up sticks, washing windows, etc. I would respectfully ask anyone who has the time and ability, feel free to help out. We will be putting out a specific list in short order.

Midwinter sailing in the South can offer some of the best





Hello Sailing Friends! from Joli and the Boisoneaults

We continue to hang out in Francis Bay, St. John. It is not a bad place to be "stuck." There are mostly live-aboard cruisers on the Virgin Islands National Park mooring balls here and the Nat'l Park beaches and hiking trails have reopened after two weeks of being closed. There are also some charter boats that have no guests until things open up, so they anchor here rather than pay for a dock in St. Thomas. Sea Glass, a large motor cat, has been moored next to us since we've been here. We heard from Surge and Kathy VanderHorst (sailing friends from way back) that they knew the Captain and crew on Sea Glass so we stopped over and met Byron (captain from South Africa) and Molly (chef/first mate from Michigan). There are four on board, a second Captain/First Mate along with Byron and Molly and they are enjoying their time with no boss/owner or guests. They plan on taking the boat to the Bahamas when (IF??) the islands open up this summer. So they are in the same boat as most of the live-aboards - hope islands open up for Plan A (Grenada and Trinidad for us) and be ready for Plan B to go back to the East Coast in case the islands don't open up to foreign boats. We are registered for the May 20 Salty Dawg Homeward Bound Flotilla to Florida

as our Plan B and it seems more and more likely that this is what we will end up doing. We will make the decision by May 10.

We have many services available in Francis & Maho Bays. There is a young woman who provides laundry service, a guy with a Midnight Express with three 300-HP outboards that picks up garbage on Tuesdays and Saturdays, and several restaurants that will deliver orders placed on-line. I rented a Stand-up Paddleboard from Reef-2-Peak right on Maho Beach. All these people are trying to keep ahead of their bills since their normal tourist business is gone. We are a 15-minute dinghy ride from Cruz Bay, so every couple of weeks we can make a trip for groceries. We are here today for groceries after our carry-out lunch in the park, bacon cheeseburgers from Cruz Bay Landing, and the use of the VI free wi-fi.

The four solar panels we installed are working very well. We run our generator every 3 or 4 days to top off the batteries and make fresh water. We go for a sail about once a week for our housekeeping activities (empty the holding tanks). The first time we went out, we were chased down by the British Virgin Islands Custom and Border patrol. We were in their waters and we were told, "This is your first and FINAL warning - LEAVE and don't come back!!!" with a shake of his gun at us. We have been very careful since then to stay in US waters.

There is a bugle player in the anchorage and he plays taps every day at sunset. It is followed by blowing of conchs from lots of other boats. We've been doing lots of boat projects, snorkeling, swimming and hiking. I tried out the Garmin mini-camera that Chris left for us in November and got some good shots. Maho Bay is filled with sea turtles, some very large, and we went yesterday in search of photos but the battery in the camera was dead. We'll have to try again soon.

We hope you are all well and not going too crazy with the social isolation. If you're interested, check out my blog at SVJoli.blogspot.com. I haven't updated it recently but I did pretty good with it for the first 8 months of our trip.
