
Message from Comm BlutarskiCommodore Andy Davis

Sadler Basin Committee Karl VanderHorst PC Matt Bedee

The basin is ready for business. Springers Wharf is repaired and the docks are in the water. We will still be using the plastic piping for water, since old pipes are still leaking under the concrete. However, the water is turned on and ready.

The hoists, which were stored for the winter, sent out to be certified and repaired if needed, are now back in place.

PC Matt Bedee has drawn up plans for dock boards. These will be the only acceptable dock boards. Copies of the drawings are below and will be on the board in the clubhouse. They can be sent to you via email upon request.

Below are some updates as we are getting within days of the 2021 season starting. Some updates will apply to all berth holders and some will apply to specific dock/dry storage locations.

Springer's Wharf - See Dock Modification section below regarding adding batter boards to your dock and other dock modifications.

A-Dock - All of the wood has been replaced on A-Dock main pier, additional cleats have been installed on the main pier structure, and the end metal float that has been pulling down the end of A-Dock over the last couple years was replaced. Over the next two or so years the metal tank docks will be replaced with new docks. As that process moves forward, see the Dock Modification section below regarding batter boards being attached to the new docks as they are replaced.

B-Dock - The deck boards and verticals replacement will be completed over the next couple weeks. Additional cleats will also be installed as part of this upgrade project to provide three cleats per boat, removing the requirement to share

two cleats. As the board replacement progresses, there may be times when boats will need to be moved out of the well temporarily to get the work done.

A survey was done this spring; the age and condition of the current batter boards are a safety concern. All batter boards will be removed when the vertical posts are replaced and disposed of as most are legacy batter boards from years ago. If you would like to reinstall batter boards, see the Dock Modification section below for the process to get Sadler Basin Committee approval before making modifications.

C-Dock - Once A-Dock's dock replacement has been completed, plans for modifications/upgrades will be developed for C-Dock to increase dock length and to replace the 30 foot docks on B-Dock as part of that upgrade. See Dock Modification section below regarding adding batter boards and other dock modifications.

Dry Storage is only for those members who have paid for a dry storage space for the season. Trailer storage is not allowed in this area once a boat has been put in the water without

Horizontal Fender Dock Boards

Sadler Basin Committee is offering two option kits for the fender dock boards. In both options, the dock holder will mark the board height (see diagram). To assemble the fender board, use the holes in the horizontal board as a template, mark the four bolt locations on the existing 3x3 verticals and drill the holes. Last, insert the bolts with the bolt head on the boat side - washers and nuts on the dock side. Tighten from the dock side.

<u>Option 1 kit</u> is a single 2x that has four holes drilled and countersunk for bolt connection assembly.

<u>Option 2 kit</u> is an assembly of two horizontal 2x's and a cap on top. The mounting is the same as option 1.

If you have trouble, please seek out Sadler Basin Committee

member Art Averell for help. Art's boat is on C Dock.

Pricing for the kits is yet to be determined. We are taking orders now.


paying for a dry storage space. No member assets may remain in the dry storage areas between Nov. 1 and April 30. Boats on trailers that belong in the dry storage areas are to be kept in the designated areas and not in the parking lot.

Dock modifications - Over the years, dock modifications have occurred, many without approval from the Sadler Basin Committee. With the investment that Sadler is making, the Committee feels that adhering to this Marina Rule will protect the club's investment along with the safety of its members. Per the Sadler Sailing Basin Marina Rules, any changes to docks or maintenance beyond basic upkeep require the approval of the Sadler Basin Committee. The club's investing in dock maintenance/replacement over the last couple years and over the next 5+ years, it's important that we adhere to the Dock Maintenance Rule that has been in place. This specifically applies to batter boards being attached to the dock verticals. At the April Sadler Basin Committee meeting, it was discussed that there would be two versions that members could request approval for - a single board and a double board with a top step board.


We had very strict COVID policies in 2020 resulting in not one reported case of COVID in our program. All COVID policies and procedures are still in place to run a safe 2021 season.

NOTE: It is the responsibility of the competitors, coaches, parents, and all interested parties to be familiar with the rules, conditions, and regulations governing these championships. Links to these documents are provided within this Notice of Race.

The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the NOR means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The following documents shall apply:
 - 1.2.1 <u>US Sailing Regulations 2.02, 4.02, 13, 14.04</u>
 - 1.2.2 <u>US Sailing Regulation 10.</u> An alleged breach of US Sailing Regulation 10 shall not be grounds for a protest by another boat; this changes rules 60.1(a), 60.2(a) and 60.3(a). However, when a protest committee believes that a competitor may have breached Regulation 10.03, it shall follow the process described in the Championships Code of Conduct.
 - 1.2.3 The sections of the <u>Conditions for the Junior Sailing Championship</u> applicable to the Area Championships.
 - 1.2.4 US Sailing's SafeSport Handbook
 - 1.2.5 <u>US Sailing's Code of Conduct</u>
 - 1.2.6 <u>The US Sailing Championship Support Vessel Policy</u>. This will be a Grade 1 Coaching event.
- 1.3 This Championship is not being conducted as a sanctioned or class association event. Only the Equipment Measurement Rules for the Laser Radial and C420 classes shall apply.
- 1.4 RRS 60.1(a) is changed to prohibit a boat from protesting another boat for an alleged breach of any class rule other than class equipment measurement rules.
- 1.5 RRS 40 is changed to require that each competitor wear a USCG-approved life jacket that is 100% dependent on foam for flotation and the appropriate size for the sailor, at all times while on the water, except for brief periods while adding or removing clothing.

2. ELIGIBILITY and ENTRY

- 2.1 Competitors meeting the following criteria are eligible to compete in US Sailing's Chubb Junior Area E Championships. All criteria shall be met prior to the start of the first race.
 - 2.1.1 Competitors shall have reached their 13th birthday but not their 19th birthday during the calendar year of competition.
 - 2.1.2 Competitors shall be individual or family members in good standing of US Sailing at the time of registration and the event.
 - 2.1.3 Competitors shall be eligible to compete under the regulations, policies and rules of USOPC or its affiliated organizations.

- 2.1.4 All competitors shall be members of a Local Sailing Organization (LSO) and US Sailing. An LSO is defined to include a yacht club, sailing club, community sailing program or other sailing organization.
- 2.1.5 For disciplines other than singlehanded, crew member(s) shall be members of an LSO that is a member of US Sailing within the same US Sailing Area as the helm.
- 2.1.6 All the members of a crew shall reside in or regularly compete in the same US Sailing Area where the club is geographically located.

3. QUALIFICATION

- 3.1 A minimum of five boats is required to be both entered by the registration deadline and to start the first race for the single and double handed fleets in order for the winners to move on.
- 3.2 Area E will qualify two teams for both the single handed and doublehanded disciplines.
- 3.3 Teams shall remain the same from the initial qualifying event through the end of the National Championship. Crew changes shall meet the requirements of the Conditions for the US Junior Championship (See 1.2.3).

4. FEES

Entry fee will be \$80 per person. This includes 2 days of breakfast and lunches, dinner Thursday night, and entertainment.

6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available at the registration table prior to the competitors meeting on July 1, 2021.

7. **VENUE**

Racing will take place on Sandusky Bay north and west of the Sandusky Sailing Club.

8. SCORING

- 8.1 Three (3) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 8.2 When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 8.3 When five (5) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

9. COACHING AND SUPPORT BOATS [DP]

- 9.1 This is a **Grade 1 Event** as defined in the US Sailing Championship Support Vessel Policy. See NOR 1.2.6 for a link to this document.
- 9.2 All coaches and/or support personnel shall register at the check-in table located in the SSC clubhouse.
- 9.3 Coaches at Area Championships are required to have current US Sailing Smallboat Level 1 Instructor or higher certification.
- 9.4 Coaches shall wear a USCG-approved life jacket while afloat that is 100% dependent on foam for flotation and the appropriate size for the coach.
- 9.5 Parent spectator boats shall not enter the "Field of Play" as defined in the Sailing Instructions. Parents and support persons not meeting the criteria listed above shall not have any contact with sailors while onshore or afloat for the time period defined in the Sailing Instructions.

10. EQUIPMENT

- 10.1 The only gear, rigging, or equipment that a competitor may take aboard a boat is: a refillable water bottle, class-legal compass, flags, plastic bucket or bailer, normally equipped ditty-bag, personal effects, PFDs and protective clothing. For the C420 discipline, competitors may also bring aboard their personal trapeze harness. [DP]
- 10.2 GPS devices of all varieties, styles and combinations and VHF radios are specifically banned.

11. PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES - US SAILING REGULATION 10.03 B AND 10.03 C, STATE:

- B. For Junior and Youth events or for junior or youth competitors in any US Sailing championship, no participant or competitor shall use or possess, either on or off the water: 1. marijuana or any other substance if possession is illegal under state or federal law; or 2. any alcoholic beverages.
- C. An alleged breach of one of these regulations shall not be grounds for a protest; this changes rules 60.1(a), 60.2(a) and 60.3(a). However, when the protest committee believes that a competitor may have breached one of these regulations, it shall follow the process described in the Championships Code of Conduct. If a competitor is found to have breached one of the elements within the Code of Conduct, they shall be excluded from the remaining races of the series and, where practicable, removed from the regatta venue and sent home. The competitor's boat shall be disqualified from all races of the series.

10. PRIZES

- 10.1 The top three teams in each division shall receive regatta trophies.
- 10.2 The top two finishing, eligible team(s) in both Smythe and Bemis will qualify for US Sailing's Chubb U.S. Junior Sailing Championships. Eligibility is defined as per the 2021 Chubb US Junior Championship NOR.
- 10.3 Teams who qualify for Chubb U.S. Junior Sailing Championship shall submit their registration to the event within three days of qualification. Failure to register within the deadline will mean the next eligible boat may move forward.



- **2.2.** The Organizing Authority shall, at its sole discretion, determine eligibility and placement within divisions.
- **2.3.** Eligible boats shall register via online registration available at <u>www.sanduskysailingclub.com</u> or <u>www.yachtscoring.com</u>.
- **2.4.** Deadline for receipt of registration is 2359 hours, Wednesday, August 25, 2021.
- 2.5. The acceptance of registrations received after the specified deadline is at the sole discretion of the Organizing Authority and, if accepted, is subject to a late fee of \$20.00. Registration at SSC will be available from 1800 to 2200 on Friday, August 27, 2021.
- **2.6.** A minimum of five (5) boats registered before the above deadline shall be required to be considered a One-Design Class.
- 3. FEES
 - **3.1.** The fee to race is \$80; for US Sailing Members the fee to race is \$75. The fee to race includes: Entry, One Saturday night dinner ticket, and two free drinks at the Saturday night party.
 - **3.2.** There will be no refunds of fees after the registration deadline. Any refunds requested before the registration deadline will be subject to a cancellation fee of \$10.00.
 - **3.3.** Other Fees: Friday Night Dinner (Pricing to Follow)




