More boats participated in the LESC than in any of the other solo challenges on the other four Great Lakes in 2023.

The Sandusky 45005 - Although the big Great Lakes challenges may be more than many singlehanders, or aspiring singlehanders, are willing to take on, the GLSS also sponsors shorter events so that sailors can enjoy singlehanded racing on a smaller scale. This year, SSC hosted the Sandusky 45005, named after the yellow NOAA weather buoy stationed on the U.S./Canadian border about 19 miles northeast of Cedar Point. Twelve boats registered, but for various reasons, only seven started at 0800 on Saturday, Sept. 16. The race was set up to run from Sandusky Peirhead Light to "45005," then to the entrance buoys at Huron Harbor, and then back to the entrance buoys for Sandusky Harbor, for a total length of 40 miles. Due to very light conditions at the start, which were forecasted to continue throughout the day, the mark at Huron was omitted and the course shortened to 32 miles. Even then, it took more than eleven hours for the first boat to finish. The last boat drifted in after more than 30 hours on the race course. AND THE BUGS WERE APOCALYPTIC!

Congratulations to the six boats that finished under very difficult conditions. Of the seven singlehanders that started, only Russ Krock on *Uncivilized* is a GLSS member. In addition to Russ, other SSC members that participated include Jerry Krantz Jr. on *Freetime*, Dan Stinebring on *Polaris*, and David Knox on *Rocinante*. Russ Krock took line honors and finished 1st in PHRF A and 1st overall. In PHRF B, David Knox took 2nd and Jerry Krantz Jr. took 3rd. Rob Burger was the event chair and started the race by throwing bags of donuts to the competitors from the start boat.


