For the Good of the Order

Great Lakes Singlehanded Association - On Aug. 18, three Sandusky Sailing Club members competed in the Great

Lakes Singlehanded Association's Lake Erie Solo Challenge, which started just off Northcape Yacht Club in Lasalle, MI, on the western shore of Lake Erie. Racers sail all the way to the eastern end of Lake Erie and



then finish at the Erie Yacht Club in Erie, PA.

There were 17 competitors all together, three of them from SSC: Lease Schock (Tartan 10), Rob Burger (Beneteau 41), and Russ Krock (Schock 35). This is a pretty significant number of local sailors considering that these challenges pull competitors from the entire midwest region. SSC had a very successful Lake Erie Solo Challenge this year. Of the 17 boats signed up, 16 started and 12 finished, including all three of the SSC boats (SSC was the only club with multiple entrants). Better yet, Russ Krock earned line honors and finished first in the top Superior Division and first overall, while Lease Schock took first in the Michigan Division. Lease and Rob have each competed in multiple solo challenges, but this was Russ's first solo challenge. By completing his first Great Lakes solo challenge, Russ is now a lifetime member of the Great Lakes Singlehanded Society. Because he was also the first to finish of the two rookies, he also won the President's Challenge Cup trophy.

we pulled off a flawless regatta. The J/24 Class was so impressed they asked us to apply to host the 2021 J/24 National Championships!





Hollywood from Oswego NY won the regatta and mounds of awards were given out to the top five boats. SSC was well

represented with three boats in the top six. Big shout out to PRO Jay Austin and Katie Langolf for their awesome work on this event.

A Tale Of A Tired Engine - Almost all old sailboats have old engines. I have a 1986, 28 foot, Ericson. That was about the first year that Ericson put diesel engines in their boats. I was told diesels last forever. That is not true. As many of you know, I got out four times in June and had to sail back to the dock three times. The engine would run for an hour and then just quit. I changed fuel filters. That didn't help. I thought I had dirty or wet fuel. That was not the problem. So I called Great Lakes Diesel.

They had replaced all of the cracked water and fuel hoses in April. They knew my engine. At first they suspected a tired fuel pump, installed a new one, the engine started, but when the technician put it in reverse, black smoke arose from the transom. I said, "That's not good." He thought it was just dirty fuel still in the line. After five minutes of running, he put it back in reverse and black smoke rose again. This time I asked, "Could that be a ring job?" The technician said "We shall see." The long story short is that when he hooked up his compression meter to the glow plug holes, I had 240 PSI in one cylinder and 260 PSI in the other. Diesel engines need at least 300 PSI to run well.

The two options were to find a new or rebuilt engine and replace my tired old one or rebuild the engine I had. Rebuilding my old engine was half the price and all the new hoses fit correctly. The problem was that would take four to 5 weeks to rebuild. I missed sailing *LetUsPray* the last week in June, all of July and 10 days in August. Great Lakes Diesel had a hard time finding some 32-year-old parts. It turned out the block was not a Universal block, but a Mitsubishi block, (they were Universal's supplier of diesel blocks for two years). A Universal starter does not fit a Mitsubishi block. The diesel company even had to send to Japan for several parts that could not be found in the USA.

The lesson I learned from this that I want to pass on to all of you who have an older sailboat is CHECK YOUR ENGINE (gas or diesel) IN THE FALL! That way if it has to be rebuilt, it is not done in the sailing season. Check your water hoses and exhaust hoses. If they are cracked, CHANGE THEM. If one blows out, a lot of water pours in. Remember, old sailboats have old engines. And engines, even diesels, do not last forever. – PC Monty Kaufman
