Sadler Sailing Basin

Chairman- PC Bryan Huntley and Dock Master- Doug Klein Please read the information provided to you by Dock Master Doug Klein. We are attempting to be very prompt and business like with the basin.

Our plans for 2026 will be outlined in more detail at the Fall meeting. But we already have big plans in place for next season.

Pump-out station - So we can move forward with the pump-out station, we are starting to dredge the corner of the basin where the pump-out dock will be. This is scheduled for mid-November.

New transient docks - We plan to install water and power on the new transient docks we got through the grant this year so we can rent them out to visitors.

Our docks - We also intend to modify and upgrade our docks to better fill your needs. There will be numerous upgrades that will be discussed at the Fall meeting.

The vision of the basin - We will also be presenting a rendering of the vision of the basin presented to you by the Long-Range Planning Committee of SSC and your Sadler board. This will be used as a guide for the future, and possibly allow us to obtain grant money to fix our out walls and develop the new sailing center.

In-Water Winter Storage - Sign-up for storing your boat in the water at SSC this winter has begun. We will be using the docks on Springer's Wharf this year, which means we can handle longer boats up to 45'. Pricing is \$1000 per boat. We will require a signed contract and proof of insurance with your payment. If you're interested in our In-Water Winter Storage for this winter, please contact Doug.

2026 dock contracts will be mailed out soon. Please pay promptly to reserve your dock and to avoid late charges. Note the late payment penalties. These are to motivate those late to the starting line to get their payment in on time so we can rent to new members ASAP. We have numerous applications for docks and want to bring them into the club. Contracts and first payments are due by Nov. 1.

Please Note! Contract and insurance forms are required for winter and spring dockage. Many members are dead last when it comes to sending their filled-out contracts and proof of insurance forms. This year, we require those forms to be received by the Sadler Board prior to bringing your boat into the marina. There will be a penalty for not complying. This helps protect the club from difficult situations and gives contact information for emergencies. The requirements and penalties will be outlined in the contract form.

Your boat plans - If you are not going to need an SSC dock next year, please let us know right away.

If you are considering purchasing a new boat or selling your old one, let us know so we can anticipate your dockage requirements for next year.

Dock availability - We currently will have 40' slips, 35' slips, 30' slips, and one 26' slip available for rent in 2026. Spread the word about how great SSC is in order to help fill those empty docks. Docks will be filled from the waiting list, so get your name on it for your best shot at a new dock.
