#### Adaptive Sailing Adventures ..... Larry Knauer

Well, winter is finally passing away and it appears spring is around the corner. Yah, time to start getting boats ready and volunteers lined up for the 2017 season. We are planning to have a fundraiser dinner and volunteer kickoff orientation at SSC on May 6.

We will be moving the boats in early April and working through the inventory and maintenance items. So on any of the days in April over 60 degrees we will be working on boats. For the fundraiser we are planning to auction off the opportunity to name the four Windriders W17s, 2.5"x18" space. The names will be placed on the rear AKAs and a minimum bid of \$50 each is required to cover the costs of printing the names of the boats as well as the hailing port, SSC Sandusky, Ohio.

In addition to auctioning off the right to name a boat there will be a silent auction for advertising space on the AMAs of the Windrider W17s and Corsair F28R. These ads will be printed for attachment to the AMAs, there will be sixteen 6"x12" spots on the aft Windrider W17 AMAs, sixteen 9"x18" on the forward part of the Windrider W17 AMAs and there will be eight 12"x24" spots on the Corsair F28R AMAs. We have a price to print each size and the minimum bid for each size will be \$20, for 6x12, \$45 for 9x18 and \$90 for

12x24. We are getting estimates for what is fair market value for this type of advertisement and preliminary numbers are ten times the minimum bid prices.

Please spread the word on this fund raising event and please come join us for the volunteer kickoff and dinner. Amy is looking at options for the meal and we will keep the meal cost close to the Winter Wednesday prices.

Look forward to seeing you on the 6th of May. A more detailed invitation will be sent out in two weeks. Thank you again for all your help last year and we look forward to another great season of sailing.


