

*Grills* - Please be careful using the big grill. The metal knobs under the shelf that control the temperature get VERY HOT!! Always use a mitt or towel to turn the temperature setting.

New small grill - It's never a bad thing to remind everyone that the lighting instructions are printed on the left side shelf of this new personal-size Weber grill. The 2nd and 3rd burners each light from the 1st burner. Leo and I witnessed a terrible accident when someone was trying to adjust the flames on a new grill because they were used to seeing a big orange flame, so I am not trying to insult anyone when I remind you that.... the flame on the new grill IS and SHOULD BE small and blue in color. Be careful using both grills! Please remember to use the grill brushes in the galley for cleaning after each use so the grills will last a good long time.
