Secretary - I would like to thank Steve Clark for volunteering to try on the Secretary position. To start, he will be handling the general duties and I will be managing the membership roster. So, if you have any membership issues, please contact me and NOT Steve.

Sandusky East Bay Waterfront - On June 22, the City of Sandusky held a public meeting to unveil three drawings of "preliminary concepts" for the East Bay Waterfront. Prior to the public "unveiling," VC Mark Gross and I were invited to a private viewing with two of the designers. Mark and I offered much input as the concepts were disclosed to us. Mark forwarded an email invitation to the membership for the public meeting even before the Sandusky Register printed the invitation on the front page. We also made several phone calls to ensure that Sadler Basin Committee members and other key club members planned to attend. About a dozen SSC members attended the public meeting. The City's goal is to allow the public full access to all 1.4 miles of shoreline and enjoyment of waterfront by creating parks, green spaces with restrooms and venues throughout. One concept does not affect SSC at all. One concept shows the basin as a "joint use" body of water, mainly where the break wall ends and the "wetlands" area is. The third concept, however, would have a big impact on SSC as we know it. Among other things, there is a green space where the club sits and the Basin is reconfigured so the docks run off the junior wall. This concept is NOT a final version, nor have there been ANY negotiations with us. I encourage anyone interested in gathering more information to communicate with those who attended the meeting. Please...Stay calm! There is much more input and planning to happen. Your flag and board have been involved in meetings with the city for well over a year, and we want you to know that we are staying on top of the situation and welcome your input, concerns, and suggestions. 


