### **Scalloped Pineapple**

1/2 cup butter or margarine, melted

1 cup granulated sugar

3 eggs, well beaten

1 cup milk

1 8-oz. and 1 20-oz. can crushed pineapple in pineapple juice

4 cup cubes of hearty white bread (~4 slices)

Combine butter or margarine, sugar and eggs in a 2 1/2 - quart casserole dish; stir in milk; fold in crushed pineapple with juice and bread cubes.

Bake uncovered for 50 minutes at 375 degrees. Can be served hot as a side dish or cold as a dessert.

### Operations .....Tim Kyle

Sailing etiquette - Please be considerate of other boaters when entering and leaving Sadler Basin. Although every boat is responsible for keeping clear of other boats, keep in mind that boats under sail have rights over boats that are motoring, a boat under way has rights over a boat backing from a slip, and a boat returning has rights over a boat leaving the marina. It's a good idea to have a crew member assigned to look out for other boats before last-second evasive maneuvers are necessary

Avoid keel damage - When entering the basin, stay 100 yards off shore until you see the white light pole in the center of the opening. Then turn and head directly for the opening. When exiting, make sure you continue straight out of the opening for at least 100 yards before turning. Some unlucky sailors have "found" the large submerged rocks near the shoreline.

*Trash* - Please deposit bags of trash from your boat in the dumpster and not in the trash cans located around the clubhouse. This will help control the cost of can liners and reduce the frequency of emptying the cans. Your help with this is greatly appreciated!
