Sandusky 2018 - On Jan. 22, PC Bill Semans, PC Pete Grant, and I met with Sandusky City Manager Eric Wobser, and Director of Neighborhood Development and Planning Angie Byington, at Sandusky City Hall to discuss Sandusky's Bicentennial Vision Comprehensive Plan and how it might affect the Sandusky Sailing Club. The plan is a high-level, conceptual plan adopted by the City Commission as a vision for development of the city from Sandusky's bicentennial in 2018 into the future. One area of the plan concerns the area encompassing Battery Park and the Sandusky Sailing Club. The plan envisions various types of new development and uses in the area surrounding SSC, but it does not contemplate eliminating SSC or our current facilities. Mr. Wobser assured us that the city has no plan or intention of breaching SSC's lease, taking any action that is counter to our rights under the lease, or doing anything else that would negatively affect SSC as it is currently located or as it currently operates. He stated that he would like to see SSC right where we are for a long time to come. He also reiterated that it is a high-level, aspirational plan with no hard and fast details in place at this time. The city intends to begin the formal planning process this year and Mr. Wobser assured us that SSC will be included in meetings and discussions related to the area surrounding the sailing club. The city envisions 2017 for the start of predevelopment work and 2018 for the start of construction. Bill, Pete and I left the meeting feeling good about the direction that the city is taking with this plan and the city's desire to leave SSC right where we are so that we can be an important part of Sandusky's waterfront for decades to come. We will keep you informed as things progress. If you have any thoughts or concerns, please contact Bill, Pete or me.

Learn to Sail

Within our programs, 2016 will bring a renewed emphasis on Community Sailing for both youth and adults. If we want sailing to thrive and grow we must welcome new sailors and do everything we can to inspire them to sail for a lifetime. Community sailing centers offer affordable access and welcome people from all ages, skill levels and backgrounds. Access, affordability, convenience and inclusiveness are essential ingredients. When combined with high standards in training and safety we will have a winning formula to increase participation at our club and ensure its future.

The first step in this initiative is to offer a "Season Pass" to anyone completing Learn to Sail lessons and demonstrating proficiency in US Sailing standards. This includes youth and adults interested in using our equipment while staff is on site. Please watch for upcoming updates as these programs are developed this year at SSC.

To manage our Learn to Sail and implement new Community Sailing programs, the Sandusky Junior Sailors Board has hired Rick Pinnone. Rick has worked since 2013 as an instructor at Olympic Circle Sailing Center in the San Francisco Bay area and leads flotillas for them in the Mediterranean and Belize. His experience from this adult commercial sailing business is complemented by 12 prior years of experience at Community Boating Boston as Director of Instructor Training, Head Instructor, Junior Program Sailing Coach and Adult Program Sailing Coach. Rick holds a USCG Master License, American Red Cross instructor certification, US Sailing Small Boat Level 1, 2 and 3 Instructor Trainer certification and US Sailing Basic Keelboat/ Coastal Navigation/Coastal Passage Making instructor certifications. Rick has also been a US Sailing national symposiums presenter since 2012. He visited SSC in 2014 and 2015 to train and certify our youth for the Learn to Sail staff through the Level 1 class. Rick is very excited to return to SSC for this summer and plans to arrive mid May.






